Good morning to both of you. I hope you are both doing well and holding up strong during the last days of the regular session.

I noticed that HB 2741 is on the agenda for Monday's Senate Transportation Committee. This is of course the companion bill to Senator Nichol's SB 1669. I know that the TxDMV will have resource witnesses available at the meeting. I also know that Jeremiah will touch base with you to see if you need anything further.

I would like to inquire about the status of hearing HB 1692 in committee. I noticed that this bill was not on the agenda. I believe you are aware that TxDMV and the manufacturers and dealers agreed to a new structure for handling lemon law and warranty performance cases as well as requiring mandatory, non-binding mediation in all dealer vs. dealer and dealer vs. manufacturer contested cases which will remain at SOAH. I will not take up your time extolling the merits, benefits and cost-savings associated with this new structure because we discussed them earlier in the session. Is there something else that you need from the department? Do you have any concerns about this bill? Do you need to hear directly from representatives of the dealers and manufacturers that they are for this legislation?

I would not normally write or be concerned about the status of HB 1692. I know that there is still time in this session to bring the bill to the full Senate. However, I am all too aware that the usual hysteria which surrounds automotive franchised dealer and manufacturer relations has taken up the valuable time of yet another Texas legislative session. I would not blame you if you were leery of any new legislation in this area. In an effort to keep what little harmony there is in this dealer/manufacturer arena TxDMV agreed to let the dealers have a Senator of their choosing pick up the bill in the Senate. The dealers were concerned about other amendments being placed on the bill and not having a direct voice to discuss them. My understanding is that Senator Patrick has agreed to this assignment.

I know you are both extremely but. Thank you for giving us a status report or direction when you have time.

I will come by and see you both after the ression when you have more time. Please give Senator Nichols my best. I will come by and see him as well. Let him know that my TxDOT District tours are starting in June and that I am reck-deep in briefing materials. He set the gold standard in terms of learning about all things TxPOT. I am going to try my best to uphold his high standards.

I believe I need to point out one other thing that likely impacts our choice of meeting dates. December 8 happens to be the next scheduled meeting for the Sunset Commission. TxDOT is on the list of reviews to be discussed. In the words of the Quorum Report, the Sunset Advisory Commission staff issued a "scathing review" of TxDOT. I am the point person for the Commission on the review. I already been notified by the staff that I will likely be "invited" to attend the meeting on the 8th and answers questions from the members. I know that TxDOT, and it's Commission members will expect to "defend" us. Upshot, the 8th is now likely to be problematic for me.


